- Exhibits in the Floriculture Department must have been grown by the exhibitor within the county, district or community represented by the exhibitor, except in classes for arrangements. Florists and nurseries may exhibit plants, plant materials and flowers, which they currently sell but do not necessarily grow.
- Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled.
- Send all entry forms to: Madera District Fair, 1850 W. Cleveland Ave., Madera, CA 93637.
- Under no circumstances will flowers for exhibits be assembled in the show area. Tables for assembling exhibits will be provided outside the flower pavilion.
- Containers will be furnished for cut flowers and must be used by exhibitors.
- Judges shall award first, second, and third place according to merit and if without merit, no award shall be made.
- Mark your containers. The flower show management will not be responsible for loss or breakage.

- Roses, except Polyantha, ramblers and cluster types, should be disbudded. This also applies to dahlias, carnations and asters.
- Foliage and accessories are permitted in all classifications of flower arrangements.
- List variety or color on entry form for all "Any Variety Not Listed".
- Gardens may be started anytime after September 3, 2009.

4. An identification card should be provided to place on garden exhibits after judging. No commercial recognition permitted.
5. Plant materials for Model Garden exhibits must be growing with roots well established in order to avoid wilt and disorderly appearance. If plants are not rooted exhibit will be disqualified.
6. Gates will be open from 8 AM to 10 AM for watering gardens. During the Fair gardens will be watered.
7. Each garden is 200 sq. ft.
