EXHIBIT HALL

EXHIBIT HALL GENERAL RULES:

1. This department is open to Madera County Residents only.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing and abiding by local rules found in front of this book and all State Rules for California Fairs. A copy of the State Rules may be obtained at the fairgrounds main office or at: www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe/
3. Unless stated otherwise, exhibitors are limited to (2) two entries in any one class.
4. All entries in this department must have been home prepared by the exhibitor within one year (unless stated otherwise) prior to the closing of the Fair. Entries shall not have been shown previously at the Madera District Fair.
5. Names must be removed from articles, unless stated otherwise.
6. Best of Show Awards are selected from first place winning entries only.
7. All entries are entered at the exhibitors' own risk. All possible caution will be taken, but the Fair will not be responsible for loss, damage, or theft of any item.
8. Clothing and Textiles that are soiled and jars that are not thoroughly clean will be disqualified and not displayed.
9. Unless stated otherwise, this department conducts closed judging procedures. No visitors or exhibitors are allowed in the building during judging. No judging results will be given over the telephone.
10. Unless stated otherwise, entry in this department does not entitle exhibitor to free Fair admission.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES:

1. All General Rules apply. Two entries per class per exhibitor unless stated otherwise.
2. Any photo may be entered as long as it has never won an award at any previous Madera District Fair and is not more than two years old. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification.
3. All prints must be taken by the exhibitor. However, they may be developed, printed and/or mounted by a professional. No identical entries from sequential shots.
4. Senior prints must be 8"x10", 8"x12". No triple mats, frames or glass.
5. All prints must include an adhesive hanger centered on the back and flush with the top edge. These are available in Madera at Postal Matrix, 126 W. Olive Ave., Mon. – Fri. 10 am – 6 pm.
6. All prints must be clearly marked with the exhibitor's name, address, division, class, and title on back of the mat or mount.
7. Except for Division 55, images are not to be modified in any way that does not display a true representation of the subject matter of which the photo was taken. Minor corrections to enhance the color, contrast and brightness of a photo are allowed, as long as it is done in reasonable increments (as decided by the judges) which do not alter the original natural form of the photograph. Modifications permitted and NOT permitted are as follows:

Permitted Modifications: (1) Images may be cropped and rotated as necessary as long as the size is within the specifications. (2) Color filters – only if they are used to color-correct artificial lighting. (3) Red-eye removal, and spot "dust-marks" removal. (4) Use of artificial lighting such as flash, studio lights, or reflectors used at the time the image was made. (5) Use of corrective functions to improve

the natural appearance of the image, such as dodging, burning, levels, contrast, brightness, intensity, tone, saturation, lightness, value, color balance, and hue as long as they are done in reasonable increments, and have not significantly modified or manipulated the photograph to appear unnatural, or deviate from the original subject matter of which they were taken.

Modifications & Manipulations NOT Permitted: (1) Watermarks, writing, hand markings, hand tinting, or physical modifications. (2) Spray matte, or any physical substances that may be added to alter the texture or appearance of the print. (3) Adding or replacing elements, or composite images. (4) Cloning, or removal, replacing or addition of any elements in a photo. (5) Digital retouching or airbrushing. (6) Artistic filters such as fog, mist, warming, sunbursts or any other special effects filter. (7) Specialized treatments or cross processing of film.

Sleeve directions: Prepare a strip of fabric 9" wide by the width of your quilt; this strip may be pieced if necessary. Fold in half RST to form a long tube. Stitch a lengthwise 1/2" seam. Hem the sleeve ends 1". Turn the sleeve right side out. Position the

sleeve, seam side down, on the back of the quilt, 1" below the top edge and 1" in from both sides. Baste or blind stitch sleeve into place, along BOTH folded edges, not sewing through to the front.

2. Please be sure your entry form is printed clearly and is complete. Include your age, grade, phone number and club information including your leader's phone number. All youth forms need to be signed by an adult leader or supervisor.
3. All general rules apply. Refer to Junior Baking & Confections and Junior Preserved Foods for entry amounts and labeling information.
4. A sweepstakes trophy will be awarded to the group with the highest number of points. The following point system will be followed: Each exhibit will be entered and judged as a single exhibit. Each exhibit will be awarded a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place. Each placing will be assigned a point number (i.e. 1st place-3 points, 2nd place-2 points, 3rd place-1 point). The group with the accumulated highest number of points is the Group Sweepstakes Winner.
